Planning & Zoning Essentials: Wednesday, April 26, 2017

The most requested training offered, this course is designed to boost confidence by sharpening skills identifying conflicts of interest, understanding legal foundations, examining roles and responsibilities, and more! This program is ideal for introducing new planning commissioners and ZBA members to their roles and responsibilities and also for more experienced officials looking to refresh their skills and build upon existing knowledge. Roles and responsibilities, site plan review, master planning, zoning ordinances, variances, how to determine practical difficulty, and standards for decision making, defining unnecessary hardship, and recent case law are covered.

Managing Risk: Making Sound Planning & Zoning Decisions: Thursday, April 27, 2017

As more communities face litigation related to planning and zoning decision, this is an essential training for all elected officials, planning commissioners, and zoning board of appeals members. Topics include identifying a conflict of interest, applying discretionary standards during special land use reviews, reasonable expectations of a developer, and how your Master Plan can minimize risk.
